This memorandum of understanding ("MoU") is entered into on **11 August 2026** ("Effective Date")

National Entrepreneurship Network, an Indian Public Charitable Trust, registered under the Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act 2010, with its office at 6th Floor, Bhive Premium, 48, Church Street, Bengaluru-560001, Karnataka (herein referred to as the "**Foundation**", which expression shall, unless it's repugnant to the meaning or context thereof, be deemed to mean and include its successors in interest and assigns)

AND

AND

Indian Industries Association (IIA), an apex representative body for Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) in India, located at IIA Bhawan, Vibhuti Khand, Gomtinagar, Lucknow - 226010 (herein referred to as the "**IIA/Anchor Partner**" which expression shall, unless it's repugnant to the meaning or context thereof, be deemed to mean and include its successors in interest and permitted assigns).

Foundation and Partner shall hereinafter each be referred to as a "Party", and collectively as the "Parties", as the context may require.

WHEREAS:

A. The Foundation's main objectives are entrepreneurship development, to build and enhance the entrepreneurship ecosystem and for skilling through various modes of Operating Workshops, trainings etc. Wadhvani Operating Foundation (WOF) also known as Foundation (WF) has procured and/or developed world class curricula, content and methodology for its objectives (hereinafter referred to as "Wadhvani Curricula, Content and Methodology"). The details of "Wadhvani Curricula, Content and Methodology" in this MoU. WOF/WF includes the program(s) mentioned in this MoU. WOF/WF provided all the rights to the Foundation for the use and offer the "Wadhvani Curricula, Content and Methodology" to its partners, who are willing to cooperate for the objectives of WOF/WF.

B. IIA Founded originally in 1985 as the U.P. Chapter of the National Alliance of Young Entrepreneurs (NAYE), it was renamed the IIA in July 1992. Headquartered in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh, it represents over 8,000 to 9,000 MSME members through a network of more than 40 chapters spanning Uttar Pradesh, Delhi, Uttarakhand, and surrounding. IIA is designated as an "**Anchor Partner**" of the Foundation in the Uttar Pradesh and Delhi NCR. As an Anchor Partner, IIA shall engage in a long-term, recurring and structured collaboration with the Foundation for the purpose of identifying, referring and supporting the onboarding of eligible Ventures from its member network, affiliated associations and ecosystem contacts across Uttar Pradesh and Delhi NCR.

that this MoU shall be **NOW THEREFORE** The Parties agree that this MoU shall be non-binding in nature and does not create any legal or financial obligations between the Parties, except for the Privacy and Protection of Intellectual Property Rights, Data Privacy and Protection, Confidential Information, Dispute Resolution and Indemnity provisions under this MoU. The Anchor Partner and the Foundation agree to work together systematically to achieve the objectives as contemplated under this MoU.

1. Objectives and Scope of the Program

The objectives and scope of the Program are detailed in **Annexure I - Objectives and Scope of the Program**.

2. Foundation's Roles and Responsibilities

The roles and responsibilities of the Foundation are detailed in **Annexure II - Foundation's Roles and Responsibilities** to this MoU.

3. Anchor Partner's Roles and Responsibilities

The roles and responsibilities of the Anchor Partner are detailed in **Annexure III - Anchor Partner's Roles and Responsibilities** to this MoU.

4. General Terms and Conditions

4.1 Term & Renewal

This MoU shall be effective from the **Effective Date** as mentioned above until **31 December 2027** or completion of the Program activities as mentioned under this MoU, whichever is earlier.

4.2 Termination

- Either Party may terminate this MoU by providing the other Party with prior written notice of Sixty (60) days.
- In the event of any Party failing to fulfil its obligations as contemplated under this MoU, the other Party may notify in writing to cure such breach within thirty (30) days, failing which this MoU may be terminated forthwith at the option of the notifying Party.

4.3 Financial Terms

- Each Party will bear the costs and expenses for fulfilling its respective roles and responsibilities provided under this MoU. Parties do not owe any amount to the other Party for the Program contemplated in this MoU.

the Anchor Partner and/or the Foundation will not charge the Anchor Partner and/or the Ventures involved for Curricula, Content and Methodology" and/or for the access to Foundation's learning management platform or any other third-party platforms used by Foundation for the Program contemplated under this MoU.

Anchor Partner shall not charge the Ventures for any activities contemplated under this MoU and/or providing access to "Wadhvani Curricula, Content and Methodology" and/or for the access to Foundation's learning management platform and/or any other third-party platforms used by Foundation for the Program without prior written consent of the Foundation.

4.4 Intellectual Property Rights

"Intellectual Property" or "IP" includes creations, domain names, inventions, know-how, trade or business secrets, patents, copyrights, trademarks, logos, designs, works of authorship, software programs, papers, models, teaching techniques, research projects, databases and instruction manuals. Each Party shall retain all rights to its IP and nothing contained in this MoU, nor the use of the IP in the publicity, advertising, or promotional or other material relating to the fulfillment of the obligations of the Parties contained herein shall be construed as giving to any Party any right, title or interest of any nature whatsoever to any of the other Party's IP. "Wadhvani Curricula, Content and Methodology" and/or any other third-party platforms provided by Foundation for the Program, for which Foundation has the right to provide for the Anchor Partner with or without any charges should not be construed as giving any rights, title or interest of whatsoever nature to Anchor Partner on such IP. Parties undertake and acknowledge that, if any third-party IP is used/utilized for the purposes of this MoU, it shall obtain required permits/licenses from the IP owner/competent authority and each Party shall be solely responsible for such third-party IP. Anchor Partner shall not copy or reproduce Foundation/WOF's and/or WOF's IP/Venture's IP. Any usage of Foundation's and/or WOF's IP and/or Venture's IP by Anchor Partner shall be post obtaining written authorization from Foundation/WOF/Ventures, which will be for a limited period as mentioned in such authorization. Any resulting IP pursuant to this MoU shall be owned by the respective owners and such resulting IP ownership shall be intimated to the other Party in writing within thirty (30) days or else other Party shall not have any liability whatsoever.

4.5 Data Privacy and Protection

The Parties hereby declare that they will comply with the applicable laws in force concerning data privacy and data protection within the scope of their activities under this MoU. Parties also agree to adhere to respective privacy policies of the Parties. Parties agree not to share externally any personal data/sensitive personal data/information relating to an identifiable individual (hereinafter referred to as "Personal Data") obtained or collected for the purposes of this MoU, without obtaining prior written permission of the Party who owns such data ("Data Subject").

b. Parties agree that:

- Personal Data will be accessed/processed solely for the purposes of this MoU only;
- Personal Data will be handled with necessary security controls & measures;
- Any incident of Personal Data breach shall be reported duly to the other Party and the owner of the data and take necessary steps as per applicable laws and policies;
- Personal Data will not be retained for longer than required for the purposes of this MoU;
- If Personal Data access is legally required by competent authorities, Parties will promptly notify the data owner.

The Anchor Partner shall give prior notice to the Ventures regarding the collection of their Personal Data for the purposes of this MoU and ensure that the privacy policy of the Foundation is adhered to. Personal Data may be shared with the third-party on behalf of the Foundation or any other third-party on behalf of the Foundation, which will comply with applicable data privacy and data protection laws and maintain required data protection security measures. Anchor Partner shall obtain consent from any Data Subject whose Personal Data is collected in connection with this MoU in the form attached as **Annexure V – Personal Data - Informed Consent Form**, if collected outside the learning management platform. Anchor Partner expressly consents to the data collection by the Foundation for the purposes of this MoU. The Parties agree that in the event the Anchor Partner or any Data Subject who previously consented subsequently dissents or withdraws their consent to provide Personal Data, the Foundation reserves the right to withdraw full or partial access to the Wadhvani Curricula, Content and Methodology from any Anchor Partner or Data Subject who so dissents or withdraws consent. To clarify users are expected to complete their respective direct sign-up process on such platform or tools, subject to its usage terms, with assistance from Foundation as required.

The Data collected by Foundation/provided through the Platform for the purposes of this MoU will be retained during the term of this MoU, entire enrollment period and thirty-six (36) months post completion of the enrolled courses under the Program, whichever is later. Foundation may require Anchor Partner for additional/further information for impact assessments of the Program.

In the event of a conflict with the remainder of this MoU or the MoU becomes void, this clause will prevail as separate data processing agreement between the Parties.

4.6 Confidential Information

Any and all proprietary, confidential or non-public information and/or Data in any form and/or Personal Data/Sensitive Personal Data/Information that identify an individual disclosed and/or obtained and/or known to a Party in connection with this MoU,

considered as Confidential Information including IP details, shall be considered as Confidential Information. Such Confidential Information shall belong solely to the disclosing Party. Parties agree not to disclose the Confidential Information to any other third-party without prior written approval of the disclosing Party. Any Party who owns such Confidential Information. Any approved dissemination of Confidential Information shall be strictly on need basis and Parties will ensure equivalent security measures as of the Parties. Confidential Information which becomes public due to illegal or wrongful actions, will not make the Confidential Information a public information. Parties agree to notify the disclosing Party of any unauthorized disclosure immediately which a Party may have knowledge and take appropriate actions to secure it.

4.7 Dispute Resolution

a. Any dispute, difference or controversy of whatever nature howsoever arising under or out of or in relation to this MoU between the Parties, and so notified in writing by either Party to the other Party ("Dispute") shall, in the first instance, be attempted to be resolved amicably by mutual consultation of key-personnel of the Parties.

b. Any Dispute which is not amicably resolved within thirty (30) days of Dispute notification, shall be finally decided by reference to arbitration by a sole arbitrator and shall be subject to Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 (as amended). The place of arbitration shall be Bangalore, India. Such arbitration shall be conducted in confidence and in English language.

c. Parties agree that the rights and obligations under this MoU shall remain in full force and effect during any dispute resolution period pending the final order under this section.

4.8 Indemnity

This MoU does not contemplate or provide for the exchange of any funds/money between the Parties. Therefore, save and except for fraud and/or gross-negligence, breach of IP/Data Privacy and Protection/Confidentiality clauses herein, no Party shall be liable to indemnify or pay damages to the other Party, its officers, directors, employees or agents from and against any liabilities, costs and expense incurred or suffered, or to be incurred or suffered by the other Party that arise out of or relate to, or result from any breach or termination by either Party of any of the provisions of this MoU. For any third-party claims, each Party shall bear all the liability and/or expenses of dealing with such third-party claims. Any third-party claims and/or damages against a Party, which is caused due to the other Party, shall be indemnified by the Party who caused such claims/damages.

4.9 Representations and Warranties

Each Party hereby represents and warrants that the use of IP made available or contributed by it does not violate the IP rights of any third party. Neither Party shall be liable for any IP breaches committed by the other Party that falls outside the scope of the Program and/or this MoU. Each Party shall be responsible for safeguarding any IP and information shared for the purposes of this MoU.

Each Party has all requisite power and authority to enter into this MoU and the execution, delivery and performance by such Party of this MoU has been authorized by all necessary and appropriate corporate or governmental action and will not, to the best of its knowledge, violate any applicable law or approval presently in effect and applicable to it.

Each Party hereby represents and warrants that they shall not engage in any form of corruption, bribery, criminal activity, terrorism, money laundering or similar unlawful activities.

Program 4.10 Governance and Review of the Program

Foundation's authorized person and Anchor Partner's authorized person will enable the rollout of the Program. They will interact periodically as agreed between the Parties to track rollout and address any issues. A panel consisting of Foundation's and Anchor Partner's senior management will review the progress/outcomes and enable course correction as required during the Program's duration. The Program will be monitored for its progress and feedback via surveys and measure outcomes as agreed between the Parties.

4.11 Notice

Either Party may, from time to time, change its respective address or representative for receipt of notices or other communications by giving to the other Party not less than 10 days prior written notice in English.

4.12 Miscellaneous

a. **Entire MoU:** This MoU constitutes the entire understanding of the Parties with respect to the Program and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous oral or written understanding or communication between the Parties. The Annexures

Form part and parcel of this MoU shall form part and parcel of this MoU.

It shall not be amended, changed, modified in whole or in part except by an instrument in writing signed by both the Parties hereto. However, Foundation reserves the right to modify scope of the Program on its sole discretion on notification to Anchor Partner.

Sections 4.4, 4.5, 4.6 and 4.8 herein shall survive the Term of this MoU.

Severability: In the event that any provision of this MoU is held to be invalid, illegal, or un-enforceable for any reason, the remaining valid portion shall continue to be in force & effect.

Non-exclusive: This MoU shall be non-exclusive, and Parties are free to enter into similar arrangements with other third parties, without any conflict of interest.

Parties' Relationship: Nothing in this MoU shall be construed as creating a relationship of partnership, joint venture, agency or employment between the Parties. Neither Party shall be responsible for the acts or omissions of the other Party, nor shall either Party have the power or authority to speak for or assume any obligation on behalf of the other Party.

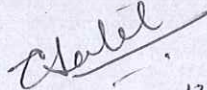

Objective of Collaboration

This MoU sets up a partnership between Foundation and IIA to identify, refer, and support growth-stage enterprises through the Accelerate program facilitated by the Foundation. The program exists to help these enterprises grow faster - through a dedicated Mentor/Expert, a diagnosed growth plan, and structured execution. IIA brings its enterprise network and outreach reach; the Foundation brings program content, delivery expertise, and execution support.

Accelerate Program Context

A structured growth execution program for enterprises with annual revenue of ₹25 crore and above. Selection also requires a genuine growth idea and growth intent - revenue alone does not qualify an enterprise. Each accepted enterprise gets a dedicated Mentor/Expert who runs a diagnostic call and a planning call, then leads execution throughout the 12-month program. The program also includes a 90-day execution sprint for resolution of critical business challenges and achievement of measurable outcomes.

- The first sprint is fully funded by the Foundation and delivers one tangible, milestone-based outcome.
- Every sprint after that is self-funded by the enterprise; the Foundation still provides the Mentor/Expert, Sprint operator the Workbench platform, and execution resources to support that self-funded delivery.

Scope of Collaboration

- Identify and refer growth-stage enterprises through IIA's network for Accelerate.
- Communicate eligibility clearly to prospective enterprises: annual revenue $\geq$ ₹25 crore and a demonstrable growth idea/intent.
- Qualify referred enterprises against eligibility criteria and support application submission.
- Run joint outreach activities to build and sustain the referral pipeline.
- Track referred enterprises from outreach through screening, panel interview, selection, and sprint completion.
- Review enterprise progress and outcomes (Revenue growth and job creation) jointly on a periodic basis.

Voluntary Consent: Notwithstanding the terms of the MoU and the privacy policies, by registering to the “Wadhvani Curricula, Content and Methodology” and the Program, the Anchor Partner/data owners provide their voluntary & express consent for collection of data, including personal data, sensitive personal data, information relating to an identifiable individual (collectively “Data”) & usage by the Foundation (which includes, any other third party authorized on behalf of the Foundation) for the purposes of this MoU and the Program(s) mentioned therein.

Purpose: The Data owner understands that the Data will be utilized, inter alia, for impact assessment, analysis, studies and reporting purposes of the Foundation.

Safety & Security: The Data owner understands that the Foundation and Anchor Partner shall ensure that the data collected from Anchor Partner/ data owners who register for the “Wadhvani Curricula, Content and Methodology” is kept safe and secure as per the applicable laws & privacy policies and not used for any purpose other than for the purposes contemplated under this MoU.

Data Retention: The Data owner understands that the Data will be retained during the term of this MoU, entire enrollment period and thirty-six (36) months post completion of the enrolled courses under the Program, whichever is later. Foundation may require Anchor Partner /data owners for additional/further information for up to thirty-six (36) months post completion of the enrolled courses under the Program. This information request will include, but not limited to: Details of Placement Company, Placement Job Role, Designation, Date of Joining and Salary at Joining etc. The Data owners expressly and voluntarily agree to provide such information as requested by the Foundation.

Dissent & Withdrawal of Consent: The Data owner understands that the Data owner shall have the right to dissent or withdraw the consent provided for Data collection and usage by the Foundation. In such event, Foundation reserves the right to withdraw any and/or all access to “Wadhvani Curricula, Content and Methodology” forthwith without prejudice.
